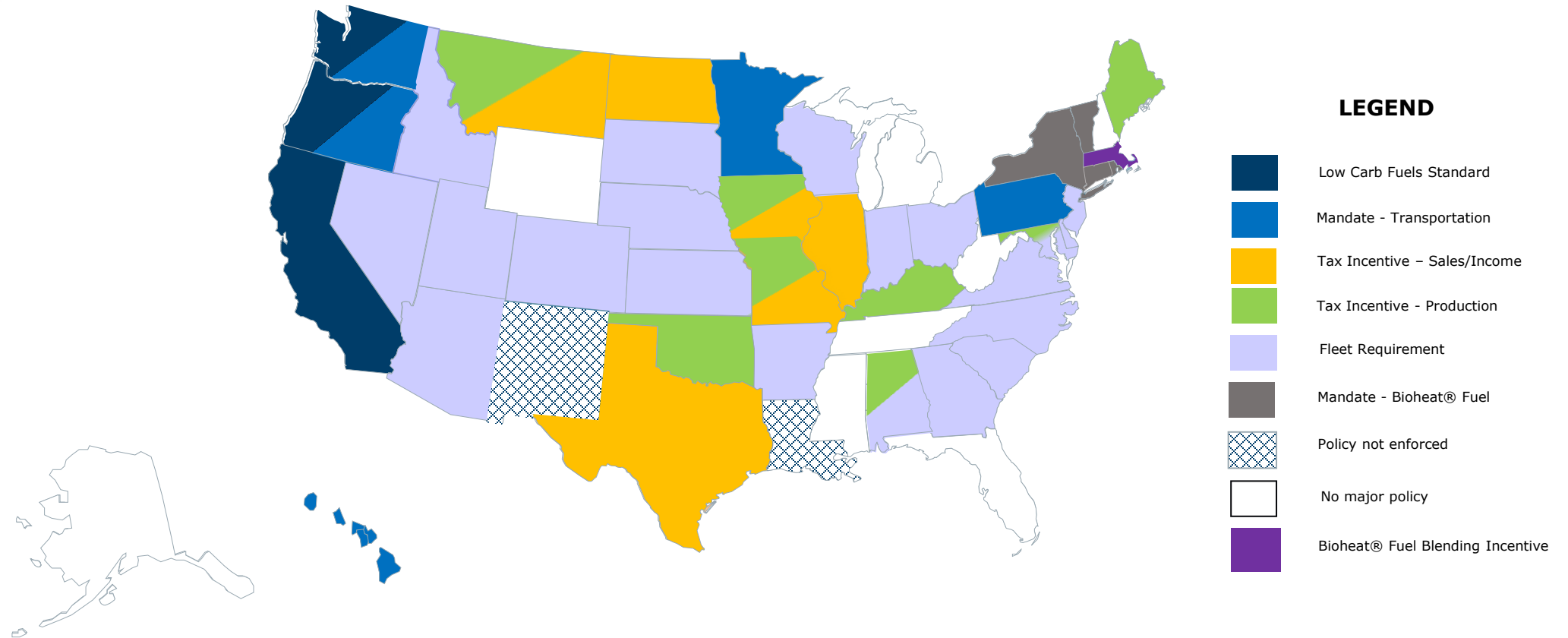




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STATES WITH NOTABLE BIODIESEL POLICIES

MANDATES ALREADY IN EFFECT

- New York:
 - Required statewide blend of B5 in 2022; B10 in 2025; B20 in 2030
 - *Clean Fuels advocating for 50% BMBD by 2035 and 100% by 2050*
- Connecticut:
 - Required statewide blend of B5 in 2022; B10 in 2025; B15 in 2030; B20 in 2034; B50 in 2035
- Rhode Island:
 - Required statewide blend of B5 in 2021; B10 in 2023; B20 in 2025, B50 in 2030

MARKET DRIVERS

- **New York:** LCFS possible for transportation and heating sector/BMBD 50 and 100 mandate
- **Massachusetts:** LCFS for thermal heat sector
 - Potential for LCFS in transportation sector
- **Maryland:** Clean Fuels generating support for LCFS for transportation sector
- **Vermont:** LCFS/CHS proposed for both heating and transportation
- **New Jersey:** Interest in LCFS for transportation sector
- **Maine:** Administration has expressed interest in an LCFS
- **Connecticut:** Regulatory process underway that may include a biodiesel pathway for heating and transportation
- **Pennsylvania:** Marketers supporting B2 to B20 mandate legislation



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
